

Institutionalizing Influence: A Comparative Study of Transnational Philanthropic Networks, Kabbalistic Epistemology, and U.S. Legislative Ingestion

Elite Philanthropic Networks and Institutional Networking

The Genesis of Elite Capture: The Yale Shabtai Society

The consolidation of contemporary transnational influence pipelines relies heavily on the creation of private, highly selective socio-intellectual salons that bridge prestigious academic institutions with concentrated private capital. A primary institutional node in this apparatus is the Shabtai Society (formerly known as the Eliezer Society or the Chai Society), a global Jewish leadership organization based at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut. Founded in 1996 by graduate students Ben Karp, Noah Feldman, Michael Alexander, future United States Senator Cory Booker, and Rabbi Shmully Hecht—a rabbi of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement who also established Yale's Chabad-Lubavitch house—the society was designed to bring together Jewish and non-Jewish leaders in an exclusive salon setting.

Operating as an independent entity not officially affiliated with Yale University, the Shabtai Society has been described by media as an elite, exclusive alternative to traditional Ivy League secret societies like Skull and Bones. The society hosts weekly Shabbat dinners and discussion-based salons under strict off-the-record protocols designed to foster intimate conversations among a diverse group of student members, faculty, and prominent external guests.

In 2001, to mark Yale's tercentennial, the society launched the "Yale 300" project, capturing recorded interviews with 300 prominent Jewish alumni across corporate, legal, and cultural sectors. The participant registry included Blackstone co-founder Stephen A. Schwarzman, legal scholar Alan Dershowitz, first-amendment attorney Floyd Abrams, journalist Peter Beinart, real estate developer Dan Rose, media executive Steven Brill, philanthropist Susan Crown, technology executive Rob Glaser, architectural critic Paul Goldberger, media analyst Jeff Greenfield, real estate magnate Samuel Heyman, technology pioneer Donna Dubinsky, Yale President Richard Levin, financial executive Robert Pozen, foreign policy analyst Gideon Rose, real estate investor Robert Baker, real estate developer Jonathan F. Rose, biotechnology executive Jonathan Rothberg, private equity investor Joshua Bekenstein, architect Robert Stern, trial lawyer Stephen Susman, writer Calvin Trillin, and playwright Wendy Wasserstein. By 2019, the society began expanding globally, launching "Shabtai Global" to host intimate, home-based discussions in New York, Los Angeles, and Tel Aviv, initiated by a kickoff event hosted by pharmaceutical executive and Yale alumnus Vivek Ramaswamy. The society's

permanent residence, the historic John C. Anderson Mansion, was acquired in 2014 for \$1.5 million. This purchase was funded by a donation of over \$1 million from Israeli-American multimillionaire businessman and investor Benny Shabtai, after whom the society was subsequently renamed.

Benny Shabtai and the Intersecting Intelligence-Compromise Pipeline

The financial capitalization and physical expansion of the Shabtai Society are directly linked to Benny Shabtai, whose background bridges corporate enterprise, sovereign military logistics, and international data gathering. Born in Tel Aviv and raised on a kibbutz, Shabtai served in the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) during the 1967 Six-Day War and subsequently worked as a bodyguard for the Israeli ambassador in Paris. After relocating to the United States, Shabtai built a fortune as the owner and president of Raymond Weil USA (1977–2009) and founded the jewelry brand DiModolo in 2000.

Shabtai's primary venture investment, a major stake in the Israeli instant-messaging, voice, and video calling application Viber, yielded the Shabtai family (including his brother Gilad and nephew Ofer) approximately \$500 million when the company was sold to the Japanese conglomerate Rakuten in February 2014 for \$900 million. This transaction became the target of a federal lawsuit, *Next Communications, Inc. et al v. Viber Media, Inc.*, which alleged the intellectual property theft of proprietary routing technologies and secure network architectures. Technical reviews of these routing protocols suggested they could function as a mass-surveillance backdoor, providing real-time data harvesting capabilities. Symmetrically, the Shabtai family maintained active investments in the Israeli arms industry.

For nearly two decades, Shabtai served on the board of directors of the Friends of the Israel Defense Forces (FIDF), a 501(c)(3) organization collecting U.S. donations for IDF personnel. He chaired the FIDF National New York Gala Dinner at the Waldorf Astoria from 1996 to 2012, transforming it into a high-yield fundraising engine that secured \$23 million in 2011 and \$26 million in 2012.

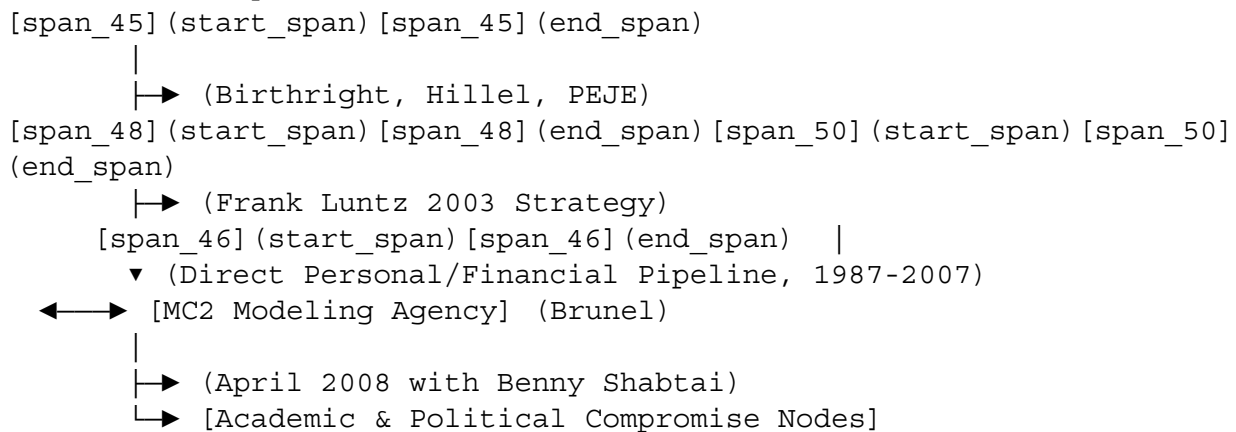
In April 2008, while serving as FIDF chairman, Shabtai traveled to Israel alongside financier Jeffrey Epstein. At the time, Epstein was under federal indictment in Florida for sex trafficking minors and had already entered a preliminary guilty plea. During this trip, Shabtai and Epstein

engaged in discussions with senior Israeli military officials and toured IDF bases, purportedly to fund undisclosed defense operations. This trip occurred during a documented archival data gap within the files of the U.S. Attorney's office for the Southern District of Florida, highlighting the high-level clearance and structural protection enjoyed by the network's key operators. The operations of the Epstein-Shabtai network converged with the physical compromise pipelines managed by Jean-Luc Brunel's MC2 modeling agency. MC2 provided the logistics to transport victims across sovereign borders, bypass immigration scrutiny, and establish physical environments where elite political and corporate figures could be systematically compromised. This physical compromise loop was sealed operationally following the custodial death of Brunel in February 2022.

The Mega Group: Para-State Philanthropy and Lobbying

The operational architecture of the Shabtai-Epstein network was structurally embedded within the Mega Group (originally founded in 1991 as the Study Group). Conceived by billionaire retail magnate Leslie Wexner and Seagram spirits executive Charles Bronfman, the Mega Group operated as an informal, highly exclusive syndicate of up to fifty billionaire philanthropists concerned with Jewish identity, strategic philanthropy, and Middle East foreign policy. The core roster included Michael Steinhardt, Ronald Lauder, Steven Spielberg, Max Fisher, Laurence Tisch, Leonard Abramson, Lester Crown, and Harvey Meyerhoff.

Meeting twice annually for multi-day seminars, the Mega Group functioned as a "para-state" entity capable of deploying private capital to bypass traditional diplomatic channels. The group was responsible for funding and launching Taglit-Birthright Israel (co-founded by Bronfman and Steinhardt), the Partnership for Excellence in Jewish Education (PEJE), and the modernization of Hillel International. The group also functioned as a pro-Israel lobbying block, attempting to influence U.S. Middle East policy. In 2003, the group employed Republican political consultant Frank Luntz to engineer public and political messaging to mobilize American support for Israel. The structural overlap between the Mega Group and transnational intelligence networks is centered on the relationship between Leslie Wexner and Jeffrey Epstein. From 1987 to 2007, Wexner served as Epstein's primary client, granting him sweeping power of attorney and providing the capital liquidity that insulated Epstein's operations from public or regulatory audit. Historical counterintelligence assessments have pointed to Epstein's integration into these networks as part of a highly structured foreign influence operation designed to execute elite

capture and generate intelligence assets.

Comparative Literature Analysis: Theological Epistemology and Strategic Policy

The Kabbalistic Preamble: Sefirot, Nephesh Elokit, and Klippot

The conceptual mechanics of contemporary national security policies can be cross-referenced with the lexical structure of historical Kabbalistic philosophy. In the Kabbalistic worldview, particularly as codified within Chabad-Chassidic literature, the universe is governed by a series of divine emanations known as the *Sefirot*, which exist in dynamic tension. For example, the

attributes of *Chesed* (lovingkindness/expansion) and *Gevurah* (severity/restriction/strength) must be balanced to maintain cosmic order and prevent the descent of creation into chaos. Human character and divine interaction are viewed through this structural model. Underneath this cosmic schema, the soul is divided into competing impulses: the *Nephesh Elokit* (the divine soul, which possesses an innate desire for spiritual alignment and purity) and the *Nephesh HaBahamit* (the animal soul, oriented toward material survival). The material world itself is enveloped by *Klippot* (literal "husks" or "shells" of impurity). The *Klippot* act as metaphysical barriers that conceal the divine light. To release the divine sparks trapped within material reality, the *Klippot* must either be elevated through spiritual refinement or, in the case of three completely impure *Klippot*, shattered through rigorous, uncompromising force. When mapped onto modern geopolitical doctrines, these theological constructs undergo a process of secularized ingestion. Think tanks like the Foundation for Defense of Democracies (FDD) and partnering policy networks utilize a structurally identical binary framework to divide the global arena into distinct spheres. The *Nephesh Elokit* corresponds to the "pluralistic, democratic sphere" that represents civilized order and must be protected. Conversely, adversarial states, transnational terror networks, and non-aligned political entities are categorized as *Klippot*—opaque, corrupting barriers that threaten civilized society and must be isolated, de-platformed, or destroyed.

Ingestion of Halachic Warfare into Think-Tank Blueprints

The translation of theological categories into national security policy is illustrated by the alignment between the halachic doctrines of Chabad and the "maximum pressure" frameworks promoted by associated think tanks. Under the military theology of the Chabad Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, the ethics of warfare are defined by the biblical directive *ad ridtah*—"until it is subdued". Codified by Maimonides and derived from Shammai, this principle dictates that once a military engagement has commenced, it must not be executed through limited, defensive containment. Instead, the adversary must be brought to a point of total surrender and complete neutralization. The Rebbe vocally critiqued the Israeli government's historical reliance on "containment" or "mowing the grass," arguing that limited military operations are morally and strategically counterproductive because they prolong conflict and embolden hostile forces. Instead, the doctrine of *ad ridtah* demands decisive siege tactics and precision kinetic action designed to force immediate surrender.

This halachic doctrine is mirrored in the modern policy papers of the FDD and the Jewish Institute for National Security of America (JINSA). For example, the *Dolitsky-Moon National Security Framework*, co-authored by Phillip Dolitsky and Luke Moon and backed by think-tank grants, outlines a series of concrete administrative priorities that replicate the operational logic of *ad ridtah*. The framework rejects diplomatic containment in favor of unilateral kinetic strikes on Iranian nuclear assets and the deployment of "maximum economic pressure" campaigns. This conceptual translation was formalized during the FY 2025–2026 policy cycle. Under Executive Order 14171, which reinstated Schedule F civil service classifications on January 20, 2025, think-tank alumni were positioned directly within key federal desks, allowing them to bypass traditional career-vetting channels. FDD Senior Advisor Richard Goldberg, serving as NSC Counter-WMD Director, executed the administrative actions required to weaponize global clearing systems like SWIFT to completely isolate the Iranian central banking network, transforming the theological concept of shattering the *Klippot* into a regulatory reality.

Theological Subversion and Civil-Rights Neutralization

To insulate these hawkish alignments from domestic political opposition, transnational networks

deploy specialized theological frameworks to manage domestic religious institutions. This strategy, executed primarily through sub-units of the Philos Project (originally funded by the Bernie Marcus Foundation), is termed the "Hebraic Tradition Framework". It is designed to neutralize non-aligned social-justice advocacy within minority churches, where historical civil-rights solidarity often aligns with Palestinian human rights campaigns. Through the Philos Latino program, the network directs strategic grants to Hispanic ministry networks to fund conferences, bilingual study Bibles, and fully subsidized trips to Israel for pastors. The objective is to replace traditional liberation theology with a "Hebraic alignment" that reframes support for modern geopolitical objectives as a core biblical duty. Symmetrically, the Philos Black program targets historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs), sponsoring "pilgrimages" to Israel that teach a connection between African-American identity and "Hebraic thought". By systematically decoupling civil-rights organizations from Palestinian solidarity movements, the network protects its policy ingestion pipeline from domestic progressive opposition.

Legislative History of the Noahide Laws (Public Law 102-14)

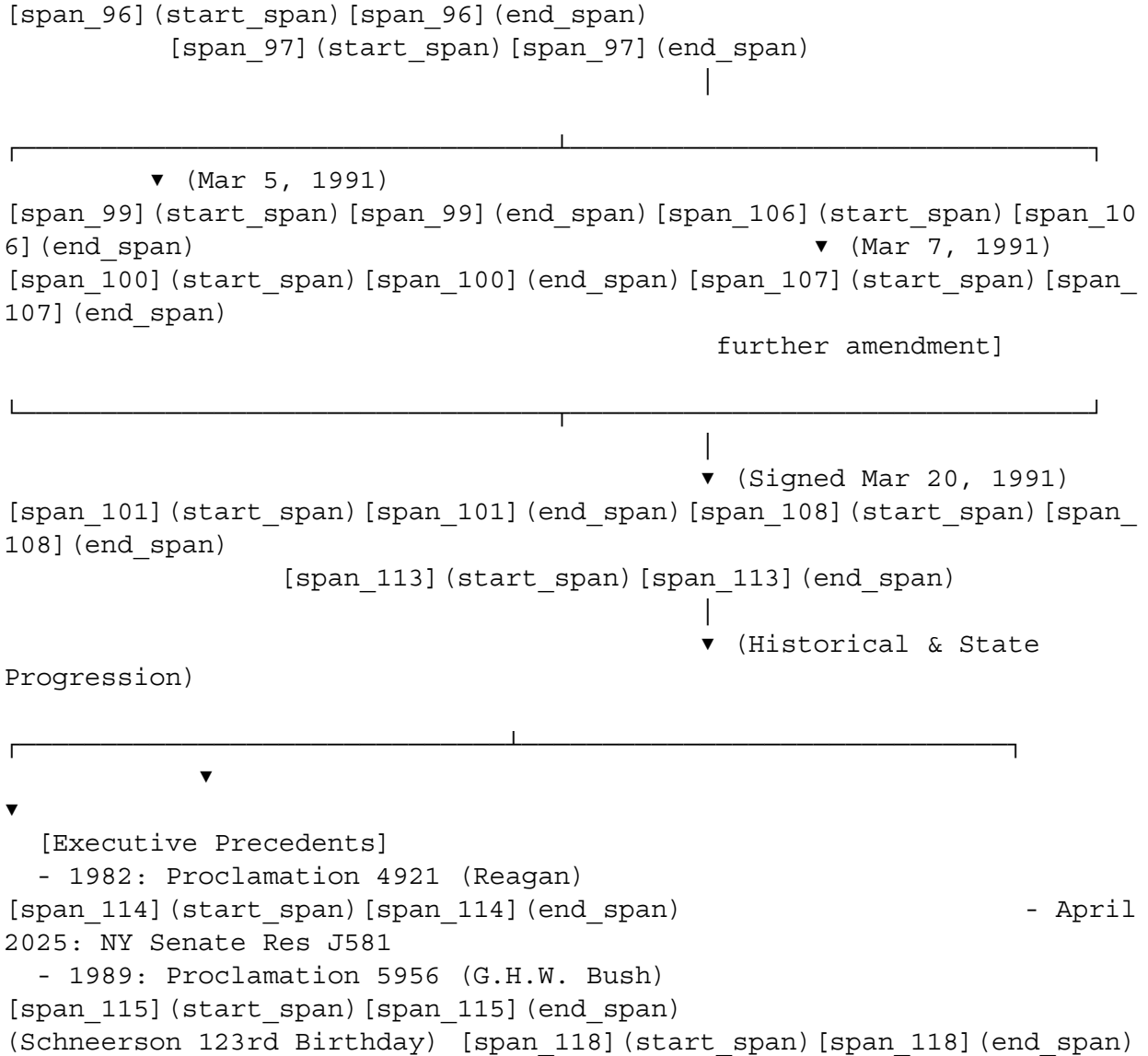
Congressional Adoptions and Chabad Lobbying (102nd Congress)

The incorporation of Chabad-Lubavitch theological principles into the statutory architecture of the United States was formalized during the 102nd Congress through the passage of Public Law 102-14 (House Joint Resolution 104), enacted on March 20, 1991. Officially designating March 26, 1991, as "Education Day, U.S.A.," the joint resolution commemorated the 89th birthday of Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, the leader of the global Chabad-Lubavitch movement, recognized for his contributions to global education and ethical instruction. The preamble of Public Law 102-14 explicitly references the Seven Noahide Laws as the foundational moral code of the nation, stating:

"Whereas Congress recognizes the historical tradition of ethical values and principles which are the basis of civilized society and upon which our great Nation was founded; Whereas these ethical values and principles have been the bedrock of society from the dawn of civilization, when they were known as the Seven Noahide Laws; Whereas without these ethical values and principles the edifice of civilization stands in serious peril of returning to chaos..."

The Seven Noahide Laws, as detailed in the Talmud and subsequent halachic codes, are considered universal commandments given by God to Noah's descendants, binding upon all humanity. They comprise prohibitions against idolatry, blasphemy, murder, theft, sexual immorality (including adultery, incest, and sodomy), cruelty to animals (eating flesh torn from a living animal), and the positive mandate to establish courts of justice to enforce these laws. H.J. Res. 104 was formally introduced on January 31, 1991, by House Minority Leader Robert H. Michel (R-Ill.). To expedite its passage, the resolution bypassed typical legislative committee hearings. The House Post Office and Civil Service Committee was discharged, and the House of Representatives passed the resolution under suspension of the rules on March 5, 1991. The Senate considered and passed the resolution without amendment on March 7, 1991. President George H.W. Bush signed it into law on March 20, 1991. Co-sponsors of the bill included House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt (D-Mo.) , Representative Lane Evans (D-Ill.) , and Representative John Miller (R-Wash.). The lobbying effort was directed by Chabad-Lubavitch representatives, who secured signatures and bipartisan support by framing the Seven Noahide Laws as a universal, non-sectarian

educational and moral code necessary to combat societal decay.

Legislative Distinction: 102nd vs. 119th Congress Joint Resolutions

To maintain strict data integrity, it is necessary to distinguish the 102nd Congress resolution from the unrelated joint resolution H.J. Res. 104 introduced during the 119th Congress in late 2025. The latter was a Congressional Review Act (CRA) resolution designed to overturn a Bureau of Land Management (BLM) resource management plan in Montana, showing no connection to the 1991 Education Day or Noahide Law legislation.

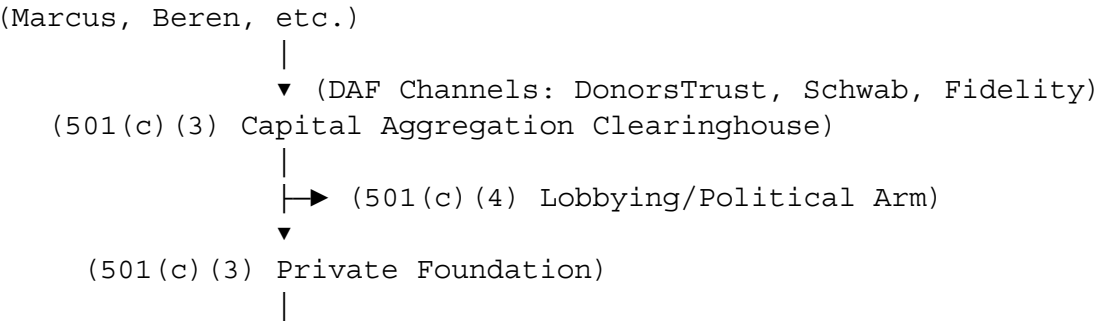

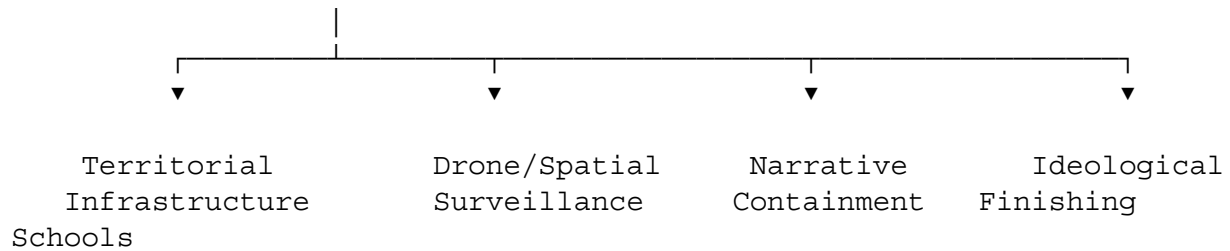
Financial Architecture, Lawfare, and Algorithmic Controls

The Glazer Framework and Capital Matching Pathways

The transnational operational infrastructure supporting these networks utilizes a dual financial and legal protocol to bypass the Foreign Agents Registration Act (FARA) and mask foreign state funding. Formulated by Liat Glazer, Senior Legal Adviser to Israel's Ministry of Strategic Affairs, the "Glazer Framework" of intermediated agency mandates that U.S.-based partner organizations maintain structural independence on paper. By utilizing oral coordination, goal-aligned independent contractor agreements, and informal matching grant systems, the framework prevents the creation of a transmissible paper trail, allowing domestic entities to execute synchronized advocacy campaigns without FARA registration.

This funding model relies on a dollar-for-dollar (1:1) sovereign state-matching program overseen by Voices of Israel Ltd. (formerly known as Concert), a public-benefit company operated in partnership with Israel's Ministry of Diaspora Affairs. The domestic capital aggregation is executed through a tripartite corporate structure designed to partition operations :

1. **Vine & Fig Tree Institute I Inc. (EIN: 99-2090467)**: An IRC 501(c)(3) public charity located in New York City that serves as the primary capital aggregation clearinghouse. It routes anonymized donor-advised fund (DAF) capital—originating from DonorsTrust, Schwab Charitable, and the Jewish Communal Fund—to bypass public audit trails.
2. **Vine & Fig Tree Fund Inc. (EIN: 99-2100887)**: An IRC 501(c)(3) private foundation sharing the same New York office address (leased by Economic Group Pension Services to obscure its physical footprint). It receives 100% of Institute I's outbound grants for targeted distribution.
3. **Vine & Fig Tree Action Inc. (EIN: 99-3826844)**: An IRC 501(c)(4) social welfare organization that directly conducts political advocacy and lobbying campaigns.

Outbound grants from the Vine & Fig Tree Fund are matched dollar-for-dollar by Voices of Israel Ltd. through specialized commercial banking accounts at Dime Community Bank and Flagstar Bank. These matching funds are tracked and routed using specific alphanumeric program codes :

- EDC761: Funding for territorial infrastructure and physical asset acquisition.
- REGAVIM: Underwriting drone surveillance and spatial tracking operations in contested zones.
- SELA: Financing online narrative containment and digital moderation campaigns.
- THE EDEN CENTER: Funding ideological finishing schools and training programs.

Algorithmic Surveillance and Content Moderation

To shield this funding and policy loop from public investigation, the network utilizes a digital surveillance and content moderation stack to suppress alternative narratives. This technical infrastructure is designed to identify and contain narrative divergence before it achieves viral reach :

- **Reportify AI**: Funded and developed by the ADIR Challenge Foundation (EIN: 99-0583740), this platform uses natural language processing (NLP) to convert qualitative complaints of campus activity into structured Title VI civil-rights violation schemas. The system integrates directly with a Department of Justice (DOJ) API endpoint to automate federal compliance filings.

- **Google Jigsaw Perspective API:** Weaponized with custom regex arrays and toxicity weight overrides to downrank or flag investigative reporting regarding transnational networks.
- **CTRL Plugin:** An edge-compute tool that parses speech-to-text data in multiplayer gaming voice channels, calculating live "Vibe Scores" and automating the muting of players who express unapproved sociopolitical concepts.
- **Flaggy NLP Engine:** A specialized semantic parser designed to detect and neutralize cryptographic slang, leetspeak, and intentional misspellings used to bypass standard moderation filters.
- **CyberWell:** An AI-powered detection platform that feeds real-time semantic datasets into Meta, TikTok, and X to execute rapid public shaming and automated account termination.
- **StopAntisemitism:** Funded by a \$3,600,000 grant from the Merona Leadership Foundation, operating as a digital targeting and public shaming platform.
- **Tisane Labs & ActiveFence:** Deep-packet text analysis tools that execute POSIX C++ deterministic natural language understanding (NLU) to intercept and contain "fear speech" and narrative divergence at the data-layer before it can achieve viral traction.

Lawfare, AML/CFT, and the Federal-Municipal Pincer

These algorithmic tools are deployed alongside a coordinated "federal-municipal pincer strategy" that bypasses traditional constitutional protections. On the federal level, top-down pressure is exerted by the DOJ's Anti-Semitism Advisory Committee (ASAC) (established on August 13, 2025) and congressional funding committees, which threaten to freeze university endowments and municipal research grants. A prominent example is the \$400,000,000 federal grant freeze targeting Columbia University on March 7, 2025, which forced the university into a binding Title VI compliance settlement that integrated think-tank speech-suppression tactics. Symmetrically, the Central District of California ruled in *Frankel v. UCLA* (August 2024) that support for Israel constitutes a sincerely held religious belief under the law, providing a legal precedent for federal compliance reviews.

Simultaneously, bottom-up pressure is applied at the local level through the municipal adoption of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) definition of antisemitism. Funded by the Combat Hate Foundation, which distributes the Beren oil fortune via the Combat Antisemitism Movement (CAM), the network uses a standardized *Municipal Antisemitism Action Index*. This index scores cities based on their adoption of IHRA guidelines and anti-BDS (Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions) procurement pledges. Once adopted, these definitions are embedded directly into local police investigative databases, K-12 teacher union compliance covenants, and public works commercial vendor contracts, creating a legally binding, localized infrastructure that penalizes speech critical of foreign policy objectives.

On the financial level, the network employs Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Terrorism Financing (AML/CFT) weaponization. Private compliance firms generate white-label briefs alleging that targeted domestic non-profits are associated with international material support networks. These briefs are submitted to OFAC and FinCEN under IRC Section 501(p) to trigger the immediate suspension of tax-exempt status. Clearing banks like JPMorgan Chase and Citibank ingest these updates from risk databases (e.g., World-Check, LexisNexis, Regulatory DataCorp), leading to automated, real-time client account termination. Key architects of this compliance coordination mechanism include Juan Zarate, Sigal Mandelker, and Chip Poncy.

Policy Textual Variance: Think-Tank Ingestion

To track how private think-tank policy is transformed into federal law, the following matrix compares the original draft language of the *Dolitsky-Moon National Security Framework* (published December 5, 2024, under the title "*Trump's Opportunity to Stabilize the Near East & Crush Antisemitism at Home*") with subsequent executive orders, administrative decrees, and binding compliance settlements issued during the Q1 2025 policy cycle.

Conclusions

The comparative analysis of elite philanthropic networks, theological structures, and legislative histories reveals a systematic pipeline of public-private policy ingestion. By utilizing the social capital of prestigious academic salons like the Yale Shabtai Society, the financial capital of the Mega Group, and the tactical logistics of the MC2 network, transnational influence operations have penetrated U.S. academic, judicial, and political structures.

The translation of traditional Kabbalistic and halachic doctrines—such as *Klippot* and *ad riddah*—into modern strategic policy frameworks has provided an intellectual blueprint for unilateral, aggressive national security actions, bypassing traditional democratic notice-and-comment procedures. This strategic posture has been codified into federal law through the adoption of the Seven Noahide Laws under Public Law 102-14, establishing a universalized moral code that aligns U.S. statutory principles with specific theological frameworks.

Backed by the Glazer Framework's intermediated agency protocols and matching sovereign grants, this network leverages Donor-Advised Funds to shield the identities of its domestic patrons. When combined with automated algorithmic surveillance tools like Reportify AI and the federal-municipal pincer strategy, the network possesses the capability to suppress domestic dissent, manipulate academic governance, and institutionalize hawkish foreign policy alignments with minimal public accountability. For policymakers and regulatory oversight bodies,

these findings demonstrate the necessity of reforming FARA disclosure rules, auditing the non-profit status of split-interest 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(4) networks, and establishing public oversight of automated algorithmic moderation systems to protect democratic processes and sovereign policy integrity.
